Condition	Float Value Range	Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Beautiful condition with little to no visible scratches or wear. Typically the most expensive.
Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Small acnes or scratches, typically just visible on close assessment.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Noticeable wear, scratches, and fading. This is the most common condition.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Significant wear. Parts of the paint may look cracked or greatly faded.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Severe wear. The weapon looks heavily rusted, beaten, or nearly stripped of paint.

Note: Some skins are "capped," implying they can not drop in Factory New condition, while others really look much better with greater wear (known as "Blackimovs" on specific AWP designs).

2. Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are color-coded based upon their rarity. This rarity dictates how tough the product is to acquire through random drops or by opening weapon cases with secrets.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, fundamental drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly better than Consumer Grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** Standard quality for the majority of collection drops and low-tier case products.
- **Limited (Purple):** Uncommon; often utilized as trade-up fodder.
- **Classified (Pink):** Rare, extremely popular weapon surfaces.

- **Covert (Red):** The greatest standard rarity found in cases, featuring renowned styles like the AWP|Asiimov or M4A4|Groan.
- **Extremely Rare (★ Gold):** Special items, including Knives and Gloves.

Approximate Case Odds

- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** ~ 79.92%
- **Restricted (Purple):** ~ 15.98%

- **Special Item (★ Gold/Knife/Gloves):** ~ 0.26%

3. **Pattern Templates:** Certain skins use a randomized pattern index (0 to 999).
 - *Case Hardened* skins, for instance, can have a massive quantity of "blue gem" coverage, driving their rates into tens of thousands of dollars.
 - *Fade* portions determine how much of the rainbow gradient is noticeable on the gun.
