Copper pipes, though more durable, develop pinhole leaks when hard water minerals and acidic water chemistry attack the material over decades. PVC and modern PEX are resistant to corrosion, but if your home still relies on older metal pipes, a leak is your warning that catastrophic loss is near.

How Does Corrosion Transform a Slow Leak Into a Burst Pipe?

Corrosion doesn't happen overnight, but once it starts, it accelerates. Galvanized steel pipes lose their zinc coating, exposing the steel underneath to rust. Copper develops tiny holes where acidic groundwater or mineral deposits eat through the material. For months or years, you might notice occasional drips under the sink. Then one morning, water pressure spikes—or the pipe shifts with temperature changes—and the corroded section ruptures completely. The leak that seemed manageable becomes a flood.



This is why we don't treat every leak the same. A leak from a new plastic fitting is one thing. A leak from a 50-year-old galvanized steel joint signals that the entire pipe network is at burst exposure. How Does Material Age Determine Your Burst Exposure Timeline?

The age of your home's pipe material is the strongest predictor of when a leak becomes a catastrophe. Galvanized steel pipes installed in the 1960s and 1970s typically fail between 40 and 60 years of age. If your home is 45 years old and you just noticed a leak, you're in the danger zone. Copper pipes last longer—often 50 to 70 years—but their failure mode is often pinhole leaks that multiply rapidly once corrosion breaches the material. PVC and modern piping materials don't corrode in the same way, but if your home still has metal pipes from its original construction, a leak is a harbinger of total network failure.
