Understanding Wear Conditions (Float Values)

The physical condition of a skin is among the most vital consider its prices. Surprisingly, some skins in fact look better or better with wear (such as particular "Battle-Scarred" Laminates or Asiimovs), though a lot of command greater prices the closer they are to pristine condition.

scratching, and noticeable dullness in color brightness. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Extreme wear, heavily faded graphics, serious scratches, and rusted aspects.
