- **StatTrak™ Technology:** An unique variant of a skin that includes a physical LED counter on the weapon, tracking the number of verified eliminates made by the owner.

Wear Condition Float Range Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Pristine condition with little to no visible wear. The most typical market tier. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, fading colors, and prominent scratches. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly distressed, rusted, or scraped. Some skins look entirely different (and uniquely gritty) in this condition.

Loadouts in CS2 are categorized by weapon types, with gamers typically picking a main rifle (AK-47 for Terrorists, M4A4 or M4A1-S for Counter-Terrorists), a sniper rifle (AWP), and sidearms.

What started as a basic modification feature has actually evolved into a multi-billion-dollar virtual economy. CS2 skins possess real-world financial value, driven by supply and need, rarity, and neighborhood sentiment.
