you can hide variation, yet the even more you can also mask concerns that should have been corrected throughout prep.

The prep job that chooses everything

Prep is where the distinction in between "fine" and "exceptional" turns up. It is likewise the component most hurried staffs attempt to compress, since it is not glamorous. You can not glamorize cleaning. You can not fake proper dryness. And if the fence company does not handle prep with self-control, the tarnish will pay the price.

A common prep phase entails cleaning to get rid of dirt, mold, and old deposit. If the fencing has an old tarnish or sealer, the cleaning has to account for bond. 1. Sun strength and exposure direction
