Drains

First, inspect the pipes and fixtures visually. It will verify that everything is in working order and help detect any problems earlier, such as leaks and water staining. This allows you to identify any damage that may be caused by weather or pests.

The other step is to keep the drains in good condition. This prevents clogs and keeps water flowing efficiently. This is done by avoiding flushing food scraps into the drain, or making use of strainers or screens in showers and sinks. Don't flush anything else down the toilet except human waste or toilet paper. Hair, food wastes, grease and wipes are all solids that could block your drains. Also, adding pipe insulation in cold locations can help prevent freezing pipes and speed up the process of getting hot water.

Water Heater

For instance, you should make sure that all shutoff valves can be opened and closed with ease. Also make sure to flush your water heater once a year to remove sediment that reduces effectiveness and extends the life span.

Another important tip is to regularly inspect exposed pipes for cracks, brittleness or leaks. Be aware of puddles that are under sinks and check your pressure-relief valve by lifting the lever and allowing water to flow out and then returning it to its original position. Test the water meter to see if it shows any unusual activities. You can utilize a heat gun or hair dryer to gradually melt the pipe when there is a leak.
