The Economics of Case Openings

The CS: GO/CS2 economy works likewise to a real-world stock exchange. Costs are governed simply by supply and demand.

- **The Active Drop Pool vs. Rare Drop Pool:** When a case is relocated to the "Rare Drop Pool" (ceased active drop), its supply stops increasing naturally. Subsequently, as gamers open them with time, the staying supply diminishes, and the rate of the case often escalates.
- **Float Values and Wear:** Every skin is appointed a float value ranging from 0.00 to 1.00, identifying its condition (Factory New, Minimal Wear, Field-Tested, Well-Worn, and Battle-Scarred).
- **The Trade-Up Contract:** Players can trade ten skins of one rarity tier for one skin of the next higher tier, providing a secondary use for undesirable, low-tier case drops.

Gamers can make passive case drops just by using official or community servers with VAC protected. Weekly care packages generally enable gamers to choose particular items, consisting of active-pool weapon cases, simply by leveling up their profile once weekly.
