Noteworthy Recent and Classic Cases

The CS: GO/CS2 economy functions likewise to a real-world stock market. Rates are governed simply by supply and need.

- **The Active Drop Pool vs. Rare Drop Pool:** When a case is relocated to the "Rare Drop Pool" (discontinued active drop), its supply stops increasing organically. Consequently, as players open them in time, the staying supply shrinks, and the price of the case frequently increases.
- **Drift Values and Wear:** Every skin is designated a float value varying from 0.00 to 1.00, determining its condition (Factory New, Minimal Wear, Field-Tested, Well-Worn, and Battle-Scarred).
- **The Trade-Up Contract:** Players can trade 10 skins of one rarity tier for one skin of the next greater tier, offering a secondary use for unwanted, low-tier case drops.

Players can cs2skin.com earn passive case drops just by playing on official or community servers with VAC protected. Weekly care bundles usually allow gamers to select specific items, including active-pool weapon cases, just by leveling up their profile as soon as each week.
