Move CS2 to an SSD and clear the cache. **Random Freezes mid-match** Thermal throttling or background software application interference. Monitor temperature levels and close unneeded apps.

Fixing Checklist: How to Fix CS2 Crashes

If CS2 is disrupting your matches, overcoming a structured troubleshooting process is the most efficient way to find a repair.

1. Validate Game File Integrity

With time, game files can end up being damaged due to interrupted updates or unexpected system shutdowns.

- Open Steam and browse to your **Library**.
- Right-click **Counter-Strike 2** and select **Properties**.
- Go to the **Installed Files** tab and click **Verify integrity of video game files**.
- Enable Steam to scan and replace any missing or damaged files.

2. Update Graphics Drivers

3. Change In-Game Video Settings

4. Manage Overlays and Background Applications

- Discord Overlay
