Condition Name	Float Value Range	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Pristine condition with little to no noticeable scratches or wear.
Minimal Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Extremely small blemishes, normally just visible upon close evaluation.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Noticeable wear, scratches, and minor paint breaking on high-friction locations.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Considerable wear, fading colors, and popular scratches.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Heavily distressed, rusted, or scraped away, frequently offering the weapon a gritty, commercial look.

The CS2 Economy: Rarity Tiers

Skins are categorized into various rarity tiers, which dictate their drop rates in-game or acquisition rates by means of weapon cases. Understanding these tiers is essential for anybody seeking to understand the marketplace worth of their inventory.



- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, fundamental weapon surfaces, normally discovered in weekly gameplay drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less typical than customer grade, however still generally low-value.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** The basic baseline for many collection and case skins.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Often forms the middle tier of case drops; visually striking and fairly priced.
- **Categorized (Pink):** High-tier weapons that include intricate art work and command significant market attention.
- **Covert (Red):** The greatest basic weapon tier, featuring the most in-demand rifle and SMG surfaces in the game.
- **Unique Item (Gold/Exotic):** The rarest tier, encompassing knives and representative gloves.

How to Acquire CS2 Skins

- **Weekly Care Packages:** By using official servers and leveling up once a week, gamers receive a care package allowing them to pick a few complimentary graffiti or weapon drops.
- **Opening Cases:** Players can acquire or make weapon cases and use a corresponding key (bought from the in-game store) to open a random skin. *Note: This functions similarly to a lottery system and relies greatly on possibility.*
- **The Steam Community Market:** The official, managed community where players buy and sell skins utilizing Steam Wallet funds.
- **Third-Party Trading Platforms:** Independent markets permit users to buy and offer skins for real-world fiat currency or cryptocurrency, frequently featuring lower fees and more robust trading tools.

Tips for Trading and Collecting Safely
