

Full Mouth Reconstruction, Bone Grafting and Sinus Lifts

Some patients arrive at Aghbashian Dental Corp needing more than a single procedure, facing years of accumulated dental issues, extensive tooth loss, or bone deterioration that requires a coordinated, multi-step treatment plan rather than one isolated fix. The Glendale, CA practice offers full mouth reconstruction along with the supporting procedures, bone grafting and sinus lifts, needed to make more extensive implant based treatment possible. Bone grafting addresses a common obstacle to implant treatment, insufficient bone density or volume in the jaw, often the result of long term tooth loss, gum disease, or simply time. By adding graft material to rebuild the area, Dr. Nova Aghbashian is able to create a stable foundation for implants that would not otherwise have adequate bone support. Sinus lifts serve a similar purpose specifically for upper jaw cases where the sinus cavity sits too close to the intended implant site. Full mouth reconstruction cases are, by nature, more involved and typically unfold over a longer timeline than single tooth treatment, often combining extractions, bone grafting, implant placement, and final restorations into a carefully sequenced plan. Patients considering this level of treatment are walked through the full scope and realistic timeline at the outset, so the process feels manageable rather than overwhelming. Because these procedures are all handled in-house at the Central Ave office, patients avoid the added complexity of coordinating between multiple specialists and offices, working instead with a single team that understands their full case history from start to finish. Glendale area patients facing extensive dental needs are encouraged to schedule a comprehensive consultation to discuss what a realistic reconstruction plan would involve for their specific situation. Financing conversations happen early in the planning process for full mouth reconstruction cases, given the more significant scope and cost typically involved compared to single procedures. CareCredit and in-house financing options are discussed openly, along with a realistic breakdown of how treatment might be phased over [Dentist Glendale CA aghbashian.com](http://DentistGlendaleCA.aghbashian.com) time if that better suits a patient's budget. Patients often describe the relief of finally addressing longstanding dental issues as worth the extended timeline the treatment requires. Patients are encouraged to bring any prior dental records or imaging from previous providers to their initial consultation to help streamline treatment planning. A coordinated plan under one roof also means fewer overall appointments than juggling separate specialists across different offices. Costs vary widely depending on the treatment involved and the practice you choose. Aghbashian Dental Corp presents fee-for-service pricing transparently before any treatment begins, so patients paying out of pocket know exactly what to expect. CareCredit financing and in-house payment plans are also available to help spread larger costs into manageable payments. Do any dental plans cover preventive care at 100 percent? Many dental plans do cover routine exams, cleanings and standard X-rays in full when you stay in network, though coverage details vary by plan. Aghbashian Dental Corp works with Medi-Cal, Denti-Cal and a range of PPO plans, and the front desk team is happy to help verify what a specific plan actually covers before an appointment. Is a root canal cheaper than a crown? A root canal on its own is typically less expensive than a crown, though the two are often needed together, since a tooth that has had a root canal usually requires a crown afterward to restore its strength. Dr. Nova Aghbashian's team at Aghbashian Dental Corp walks patients through the full cost of both steps upfront rather than presenting them as separate surprises. Why can a root canal cost as much as 3000 dollars? A bill in that range usually reflects both the root canal procedure itself and the permanent crown placed afterward, not the root canal alone. Aghbashian Dental Corp breaks this down clearly during treatment planning, and CareCredit or in-house financing can help spread the combined cost into more manageable monthly payments. Will a dentist pull a severely decayed tooth? Yes, extraction becomes necessary when a tooth is too damaged by decay to be saved with a filling, crown or root canal. Dr. Nova Aghbashian evaluates each case individually at Aghbashian

Dental Corp, always looking first at whether the tooth can realistically be saved before recommending extraction as a last resort. Can a tooth still decay under a crown? Yes, a crown protects the visible part of a tooth but the natural tooth structure underneath, along with the gum line around it, can still decay if not cleaned properly. Aghbashian Dental Corp checks existing crowns during routine exams specifically to catch this kind of hidden decay before it becomes a bigger problem. What hurts worse, a tooth extraction or a root canal? Most patients report that the extraction site is sorer during recovery than a root canal, since a root canal is specifically designed to relieve the pressure and infection causing pain in the first place. Both procedures are performed under local anesthesia at Aghbashian Dental Corp, and Dr. Aghbashian walks every patient through exactly what to expect beforehand. What is considered the most painful dental procedure? Public perception often points to root canals, though many patients and dentists actually consider impacted wisdom teeth removal more physically demanding during recovery. Aghbashian Dental Corp offers sedation options for more involved procedures, and Dr. Nova Aghbashian's team focuses on managing discomfort proactively rather than leaving patients to simply push through it. What destroys teeth the most? Frequent sugar intake combined with acid exposure is the leading cause of tooth decay, since this combination feeds the bacteria that erode enamel over time. Aghbashian Dental Corp's routine cleanings and exams are designed to catch this kind of gradual damage early, before it progresses into a cavity or something more serious. What drinks damage teeth the most? Energy drinks and sodas, including diet varieties, tend to cause the most damage, since they combine high acid content with sugar or artificial sweeteners that keep bacteria active on the tooth surface. Patients at Aghbashian Dental Corp are given practical, judgment free guidance on reducing this kind of damage during routine visits. What strengthens tooth enamel the most? Fluoride remains the most effective way to strengthen enamel, binding to its mineral structure and helping reverse the earliest stages of decay before a cavity actually forms. Aghbashian Dental Corp's cleanings include this kind of preventive care as standard, part of why routine visits matter even when nothing feels obviously wrong. Which teeth are hardest for a dentist to remove? Impacted wisdom teeth and molars with curved or multiple roots tend to be the most challenging to extract, often requiring more time and sometimes a surgical approach. Dr. Nova Aghbashian's training in oral surgery means Aghbashian Dental Corp handles these more complex extractions in house at the Glendale office, without referring patients elsewhere.
