

If you spend whenever around flight training, you start discovering a simple pattern. Numbers do not simply "take place" at a school, they relocate via a system. Applications turn into cohorts, cohorts develop into training phases, and stages turn into graduates. AELO Swiss Academy, based in Locarno at the airport area, is a good study for how that system can be reviewed from a couple of public signals.

From the reporting around AELO's relocation and rebrand, we understand a number of concrete anchors. AELO is the rebranded follower to Aero Locarno. In February 2024, Aero Locarno rebranded itself as AELO Swiss Academy, and the academy later inaugurated a new website at Locarno Airport terminal with the improvement of a dedicated garage, reported as a financial investment of more than CHF 3 million. We also recognize training throughput in human terms: AELO trains concerning 200 future airline pilots annually at the brand-new website, and about 250 trainees remain in training each year overall.

Those 2 numbers, "around 200 at the brand-new site" and "about 250 in training yearly in general," are the foundation for comprehending AELO's yearly training circulation. The rest has to do with translating what those numbers likely mean in technique, and how to avoid drawing the incorrect final thought from them.

The 2 numbers that matter: "each year" versus "in training annually"
