- **Trade Hold Penalties:** To suppress immediate skin trading utilized by gambling websites, Valve presented a seven-day trade hold on any item traded in between accounts. This substantially disrupted the instant-deposit design.
- **Ongoing Enforcement:** Valve regularly bans bots associated with recognized gambling platforms, resulting in the confiscation of millions of dollars in virtual products held by those bots.

In spite of these procedures, the industry has actually adjusted by utilizing cryptocurrency deposits, peer-to-peer trading systems, and moving domains to bypass blocks.
