

If you enjoy playing Bingo Plus but worry about sensitive information showing up on your phone's lock screen, you're not alone. Many users want to stay notified for wins, promotions, or game updates but don't want private details like prices, deposit amounts, or promo figures visible to anyone peeking at their phone.

1. Always download **Bingo Plus** from official app stores:

2. When visiting Bingo Plus websites or support pages, *read the full domain out loud*. For example, **bingo-plus.com** is different from **bingo-plus-promos.com**. Scammers use domain names that look alike to trick users.
3. Ignore links shared via unsolicited messages or emails suggesting "deposit offers" or "exclusive promo prices" without confirming their source.

2. Understand Privacy Controls: Android vs iOS/iPadOS

Your phone's operating system influences how notifications and app permissions can be managed. Knowing the differences helps you apply the right controls.

3. Limit Previews Without Turning Off All Notifications

The best way to protect your privacy without missing alerts is to limit what shows on the lock screen. Here's how to do it step by step for both Android and iOS.



3.1 Limit Lock Screen Previews on Android

1. Open **Settings** on your phone.
2. Tap *Apps & notifications*, then find **Bingo Plus**.
3. Select *Notifications*.

4. You will see notification categories—these might include *Game Updates*, *Promotions*, *Chat Messages*, etc.
5. Tap each category and look for *Lock screen* settings.
6. Set *Lock screen* from *Show all notification content* to *Hide sensitive content* or *Don't show notifications at all* for categories containing sensitive info like deposits or promos.
7. Go back and, if needed, disable **Badges** and toggle **Sound** off for categories you want quieter alerts from.

3.2 Limit Lock Screen Previews on iOS/iPadOS

1. Open the **Settings** app.
2. Scroll down and tap *Notifications*, then select **Bingo Plus**.
3. Under *Alerts*, ensure *Lock Screen* is enabled to receive alerts but...
4. Tap *Show Previews*, and select *When Unlocked* or *Never* to prevent detailed info from appearing on the lock screen.
5. You can also toggle off *Sounds* or enable/disabling badges as preferred.

4. Keep a Permission Awareness and Timing Audit

Permissions are the gatekeepers to your data and privacy. For Bingo Plus, you might face requests like access to storage, contacts, or sending notifications.

- **Only grant permissions when the app clearly needs it.** For example, if Bingo Plus asks to access contacts for social features, you can deny it if unused.
- **Keep track of permissions given.** After any big OS update, or new app version installed, review your permissions manually:

1. Android: Settings > Apps > Bingo Plus > Permissions
2. iOS/iPadOS: Settings > Privacy > Bingo Plus (or scroll to app at bottom)

Use this "permissions audit" note habit to maintain your comfort level with the data the app can access.

5. Data Minimization and Safe Support Requests

Sometimes, support requests or promos can steal your privacy by requesting sensitive details like deposit amounts or pricing figures.

Best practices:

- When contacting Bingo Plus support, avoid sharing exact financial details unless absolutely necessary.
- Never provide one-time codes or passwords via chat or email—beware of scam support accounts requesting them.
- Ask support to guide you through app settings rather than sharing screenshots with private info.
- When receiving promotional notifications, read them carefully and avoid tapping links unless you verify the domain, as discussed earlier.
