3. Adjusting a Misaligned Latch

- **The Lipstick Trick:** Rub a little bit of lipstick or chalk on the door lock. Shut the door and try to latch it. The mark left behind on the door frame will show you precisely where the lock is hitting.
- **The Fix:** Use a file to broaden the strike plate hole, or loosen the strike plate and move it slightly up or to match the latch.
