

Can a Damaged Garage Door Panel Be Replaced?

In a lot of instances, a damaged garage door panel can be replaced without installing an brand-new door. A professional can detach the affected garage door panel, inspect the surrounding hardware, and install a suitable replacement panel. This is often the most practical solution when the damage is confined to one section and the rest of the door remains in good condition.

Most modern **sectional overhead doors** consist of several crosswise panels connected by hinges and rollers. Because each section moves along the garage door tracks, a damaged section can sometimes be detached on its own. An **overhead garage-door system** may also be repaired this way if the replacement part corresponds to the manufacturer model, panel profile, color, thickness, and hardware configuration.
