Coinflip	An uncomplicated 1v1 PvP game where two gamers wager skins of approximately equal worth. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 chances, minus a small platform commission (rake).	
Prize	Numerous players contribute skins to a main pot. Each skin's worth figures out the player's "ticket" share. A spinner chooses one winner who takes whatever. Based upon the total value contributed; platform takes a percentage cost.
