What smart lock installation really solves

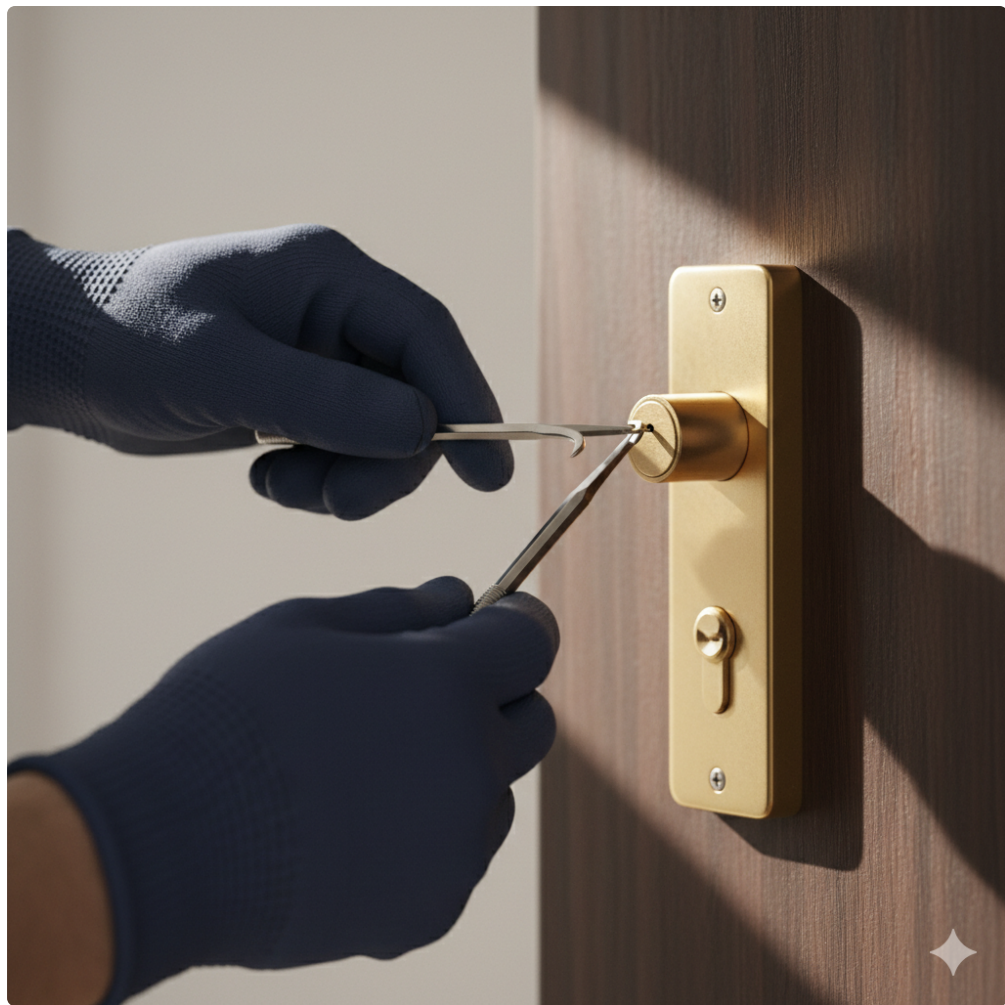
