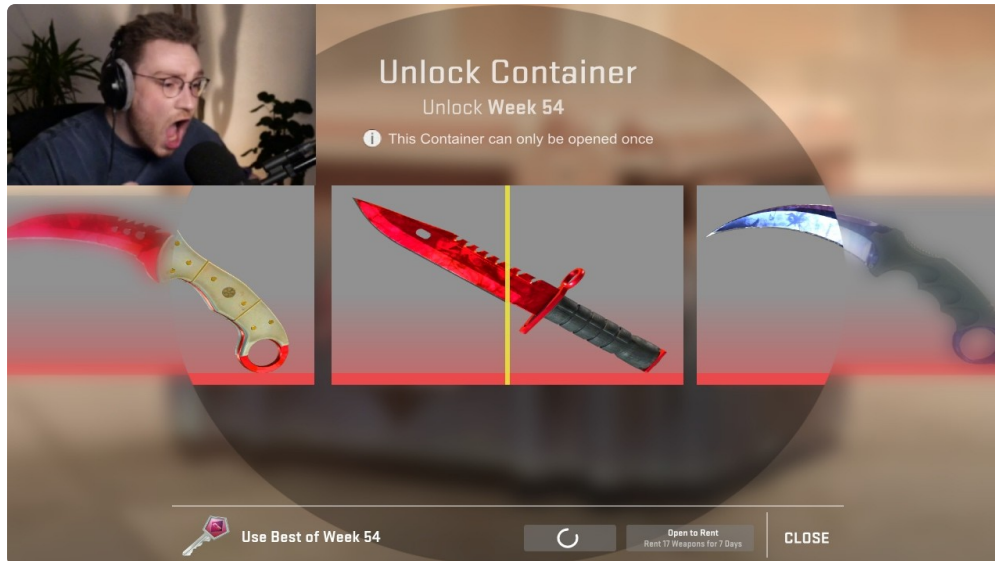

How Players Obtain Skins

4. **Battle-Pass or Operation Rewards**-- Certain operations (e.g., "Operation Broken Fang") award special skins upon finishing missions.
5. **Direct Purchase from Other Players**-- Using Steam's trade-offer system, players can purchase or offer skins directly, frequently at negotiated rates.

Understanding the Skin Economy

The skin market behaves like any other secondary market: supply, demand, and rarity drive rates. Secret factors that affect appraisal include:

- **Rarity & Float-- Factory New (low float) items command a premium.**
- **Pattern/Seed**-- Certain weapon patterns (e.g., "Doppler" phases) are better.
- **Stickers**-- Popular competition sticker labels, especially those from significant events, can include considerable worth.
- **Historical Events**-- Skins tied to champion groups (e.g., "Cologne" stickers) typically appreciate after the occasion.

While some skins have seen returns exceeding 1,000% over a few years, the market is unpredictable. Prices can drop after a case release or a market control wave.
