What customers usually notice after the call is over

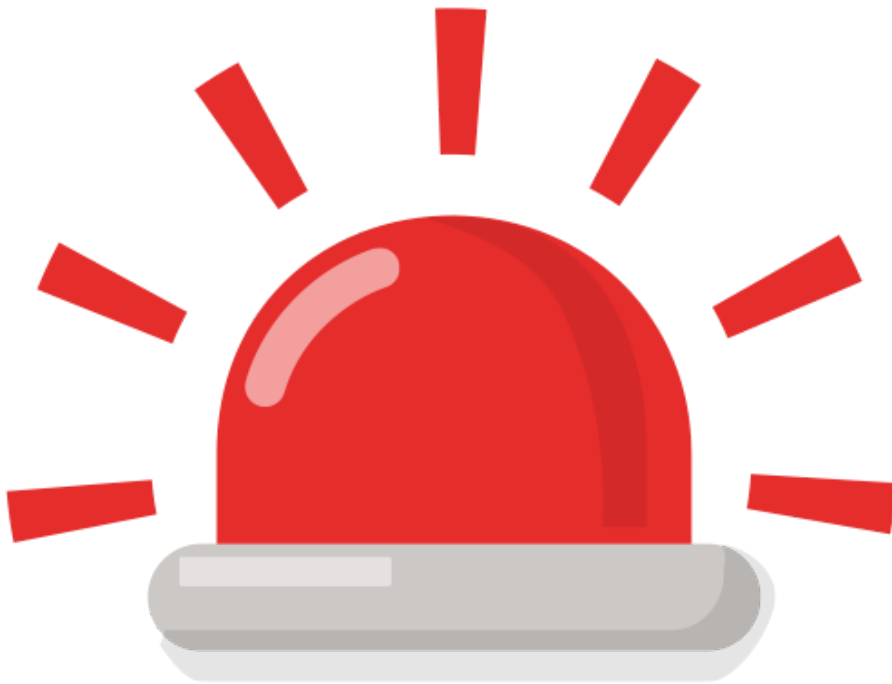
