The query that nags is plain and blunt: might George Washington acknowledge as of late's America—or imagine we deserted all the things he fought for? Did Thomas Jefferson consider freedom may someday experience arguable? Are we honoring the imaginative and prescient of the Founding Fathers—or rewriting it to more healthy brand new politics? If the Constitution have been written lately, wouldn't it even continue to exist public opinion? Have we turned the principle of liberty into one thing the Founders could face up to?
