Additionally, every weapon skin dropped from a cs2skin.com case features a **Wear Rating** (Float Value), identifying its condition from *Factory New* to *Battle-Scarred*, alongside a possibility to be *StatTrak*™ (a built-in counter that tracks eliminates made with the weapon).

Presented in 2015, the Chroma cases brought brilliant, futuristic surfaces to the video game and debuted new knife types, consisting of the Karambit, M9 Bayonet, and Butterfly Knife variants with marble and Doppler surfaces.

4. Prisma Case Series

Understood for presenting vibrant, colorful skins like the **M4A4|Emperor** and the **Five-SeveN|Angry Mob**, Prisma cases also featured the Horizon knives with desirable surfaces like Emerald and Sapphire.
