

What does garage door repair typically involve?

Garage door repair can cover anything from a small adjustment to replacing a key component. A technician may examine the entire **overhead garage door**, evaluate its balance, check the **garage door track**, secure hardware, lubricate moving parts, and inspect the cables, rollers, hinges, and weather seal.

Typical service includes troubleshooting a **garage door opener** that will not run, replacing aged rollers, correcting a bent track, adjusting poorly aligned sensors, and fixing noisy operation.
