The weapon looks greatly rusted, beaten, or almost stripped of paint.

Note: Some skins are "capped," indicating they can not drop in Factory New condition, while others actually look much better with higher wear (referred to as "Blackimovs" on specific AWP designs).

2. Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are color-coded based upon their rarity. This rarity dictates how challenging the item is to acquire through random drops or by opening weapon cases with keys.

- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, basic drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly much better than Consumer Grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** Standard quality for many collection drops and low-tier case products.
- **Limited (Purple):** Uncommon; often utilized as trade-up fodder.

- **Categorized (Pink):** Rare, extremely popular weapon surfaces.
- **Covert (Red):** The highest basic rarity found in cases, including iconic styles like the AWP|Asiimov or M4A4|Growl.
- **Extremely Rare (★ Gold):** Special products, consisting of Knives and Gloves.

Approximate Case Odds

- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** ~ 79.92%

3. **Pattern Templates:** Certain skins make use of a randomized pattern index (0 to 999).
 - *Case Hardened* skins, for example, can have an enormous quantity of "blue gem" coverage, driving their rates into tens of countless dollars.
 - *Fade* percentages determine how much of the rainbow gradient shows up on the gun.
4. **Sticker labels and Souvenirs:** Applying expert competition stickers can often include worth, specifically if they are uncommon autographs or from discontinued Major championships.
