- **High-Volatility Battles:** Choosing pricey cases (like Operation cases or Weapon Cases containing rare gloves/knives) implies matches are frequently chosen by a single huge drop.
- **Low-Volatility Battles:** Choosing less expensive, high-quantity cases leads to steadier, more predictable total values, though the capacity for huge windfalls decreases.

4. Make Use Of "Crazy Mode" Cautiously

If you are playing Reverse/Crazy mode (where the most affordable worth wins), your method completely flips. Rather of expecting concealed items, you are actively wishing to pull low-tier consumer-grade skins.
