### **Multi Day or High-Use Scenarios**

For all day festivals, endurance races, or multi-day fairs, the assumption should change once again. Facilities must not just be readily available, they need to stay functional over numerous hours. Tanks fill, products run low, and tidiness declines as the day goes on.

In such cases, go for approximately:

One standard portable toilet per 40 to 60 people on site at peak.

On a three day festival I supported, we initially tried to extend to one toilet per 75 individuals, assuming rolling arrival and departure would minimize load. By the afternoon of day one, long lines and premature tank fills forced emergency situation deliveries. The cost and logistical pressure of that correction were much greater than having actually bought 25 percent more units upfront.

# Adjusting for Alcohol, Food, and Demographics

Once you have a baseline, consider the key elements that press usage higher.

Alcohol is the single most influential variable. When alcohol is served, particularly beer or cocktails, expect more regular restroom usage and longer handwashing. Lots of knowledgeable coordinators increase their unit count by 20 to 40 percent in these settings.

Heavy food consumption, specifically at events like barbecue celebrations, food truck roundups, or chili cook-offs, drives greater usage as well. Visitors spend more time at the location and eat richer foods, both of which increase trips to the restroom.

Gender balance matters too. A crowd with a high proportion of females normally needs more fixtures per person than an all-male or male-heavy crowd, specifically if you rely entirely on unisex basic portable toilets. Women's lines tend to move more gradually due to clothes, health needs, and child care, so erring on the side of more systems visibly enhances their experience.

Children add a different layer. Families with young children often need more frequent trips, consisting of last-minute emergencies. Child-friendly features like lower sinks or little steps, while not constantly readily available, can ease this pattern, however the primary modification is just more capacity and more available handwashing.

## Event Type: How Habits Shapes Use

Two events with similar headcounts and time frames can have considerably different restroom needs.

Even where specific ratios are not mandated, a useful minimum for public events is one accessible unit for each 10 to 20 basic systems, with a minimum of one in every clustered group.

Accessible units also assist parents with strollers, older guests who need more space, and anyone who values the grab bars and broader entrance. In practice, they tend to be used more than their percentage in the layout recommends, so placing them on solid, level ground with good lighting and clear signage is essential.
