This pressure spike can reach 80+ PSI momentarily, causing scale and sediment already clinging to interior pipe walls to dislodge and travel downstream—directly into existing restrictions where they lodge and thicken the blockage. Homes around Los Angeles Fire Department Station 41 on N Gardner St and Station 147 often call us after weeks of recurring clogs, not realizing that their water pressure is unregulated and water hammer is continuously damaging their lines. A pressure-reducing valve installed at your main supply line keeps PSI steady between 50 and 60, eliminating hammer spikes and stabilizing the conditions that allow solids to settle. This engineering fix costs less than repeated drain cleaning and actually addresses the root cause.
