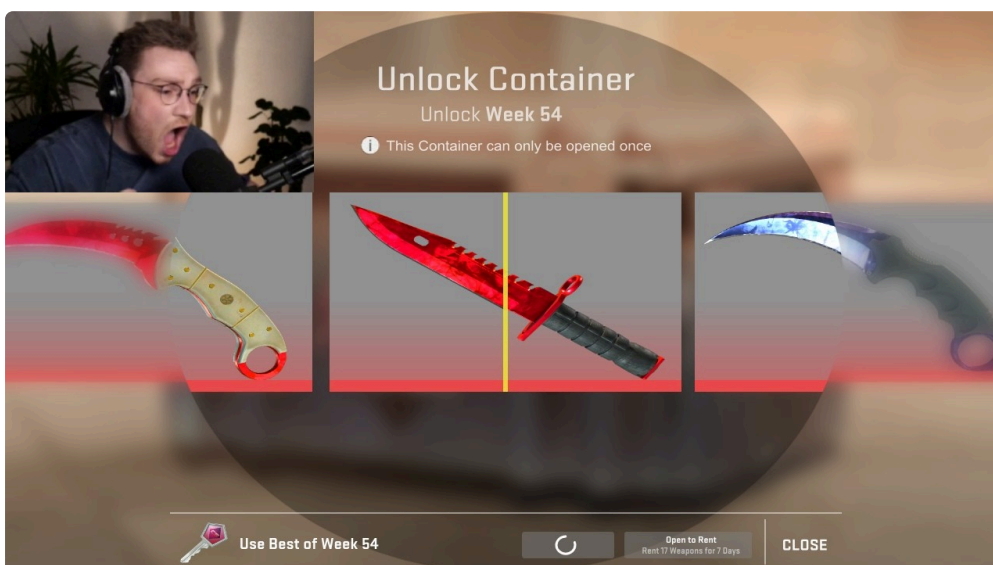

- The "Covert" rarity is the rarest tier and constantly looks like the reward product (knife or gloves).
- The percentages shown are approximate and can move slightly with each case patch.
- Prices on the Steam Market typically go beyond the in-game expense for extremely sought-after skins.

3.1 Economy Influence
