Which ant types are common in Brampton?

If you need a rapid response, start with fundamentals and proceed step by step. Immediate action can reduce activity within hours or days, but it should be done in a way that does not make the infestation worse.



- **Use ant bait** near active trails rather than spraying at once every ant you see.
- **Avoid disrupting entry points** too aggressively if you do not know where the colony is located.
- Remove spills, crumbs, pet food, and sticky residue to remove **food sources**.
- Seal or cover food, including fruit bowls, cereal, syrup, and baked goods.
- Tidy baseboards, under appliances, and around sink cabinets where ants often travel.

Ant bait is often the best first step because worker ants carry it back to the colony. In many situations, bait traps work better than spraying because they target the colony, not just the visible ants.
