3. Diversify Your Case Selection

Prevent dumping your entire budget plan into a single high-tier case like *Operation Bravo* or *Recoil*. Rather, mix low-tier, stable-return cases with a few high-variance cases to balance the threat.

4. Utilize "Crazy Mode" Cautiously

Crazy Mode (where the most affordable total value wins) flips standard logic on its head. While it can be fun, it relies entirely on striking inexpensive, low-tier drops. Do not approach this mode with standard case-opening logic.
