Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious scratches and endure popular edges and paint.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Substantial wear, paint fading, and visible scratches across the body.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Greatly distressed, rusted, or peeling paint. (Some skins look remarkably cool in this condition!)
