\* ROI (Return on Investment) is calculated as the typical resale value of the rarest skin divided by the total cost [cs2skin.com](https://cs2skin.com) of the case plus key, revealed as a percentage.

## Aspects Influencing Case Value

- **Rarity of the included skins:** Cases that include freshly introduced "Covert" or "Rare" skins typically see a spike in need.
