

Locksmith cost in Orlando usually depends on the job, the timing, and whether the technician can solve it on-site in one visit. 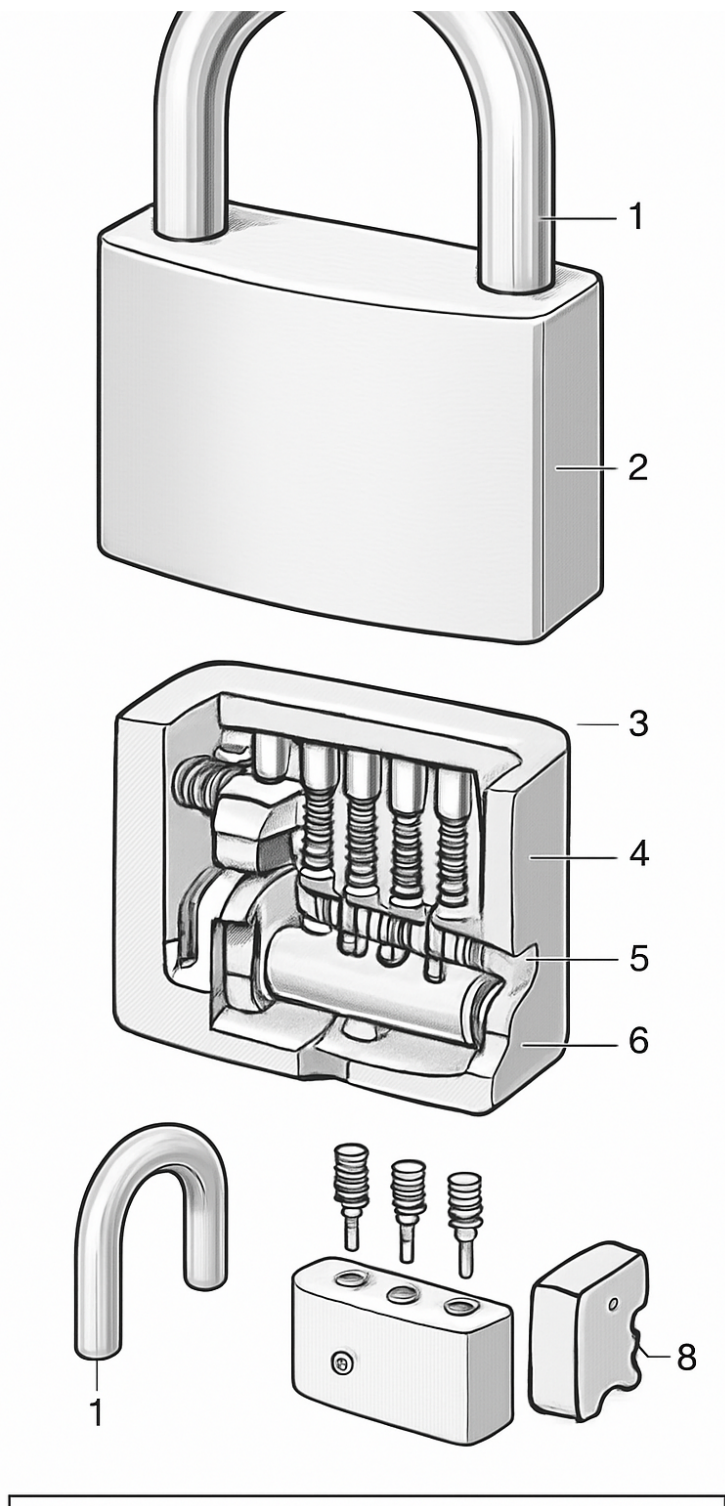
