

Garage Door Repair Price Range at a Glance

The typical **garage door repair cost** in Los Angeles often falls between \$150 and \$700 for a common repair, although complex work can cost more. Garage Door Panel and Track Repair Costs

force a door that is crooked, binding, or partially off its track. Disconnecting the opener and manually moving a heavy door without proper support can create a serious safety risk.
