One specialist talks with confidence about cabling and crown thinning, another shrugs and states they will "take a little off the top." Insurance language seems like a labyrinth. On the other hand, that leaning oak isn't waiting. The right choice can safeguard your home, your wallet, and your trees for many years. The wrong one can saddle you with residential or commercial property damage, hazardous cuts, and a mess that lingers.
