

Most of the decision is made before anybody quotes you

Outdoor lighting is one of those services where the quote arrives before you know what you are comparing. One company is quoting a template, another is quoting a design for your actual roofline, and the prices look similar until the lights are on.

Start with the design

The first question is simple: what does the plan for my house look like? If somebody can walk you through why each run is where it is, you are talking to the right people. A company that will not is selling you the same job they sold the last house.

What happens later?

Lighting lives outside, so ask who you call when something quits. On holiday lighting, the storage question is the one that separates companies. For permanent systems, ask how the app works and who supports it.

Ask what they are set up to do

The trades are related without being the same: holiday lighting, landscape lighting, permanent roofline systems, security lighting. It matters since a company with one product will find a reason to sell you that product.

The property type

Homes and businesses ask different things of a lighting plan. At a house, it is curb appeal plus practical light. A commercial building needs to read from a distance, and the scheduling has to fit around open hours. Ask which one they do more of, then decide whether that matches your job.

What should give you pause

Pressure to sign on the spot is the first flag. A refusal to put the scope in writing is the next one. An unclear answer on what happens when something quits is usually the honest answer showing through. Plenty of honest companies are simply bad at paperwork. But lighting is going to live on the front of your house, and the paperwork is the part you rely on when something goes wrong. Get more than one quote, but compare the scope and not the number. If one company drew a plan and the other quoted a package, you are not looking at two prices for the same thing. Ask each one what they would leave out if the budget were tighter, since the answer shows what they think the design is doing.

Ask where they really cover

A company based near you understands what the local roofs and the local weather do to a system. What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
