- **Wear Rating (Float Value):** A mathematical worth in between 0.00 and 1.00 that figures out how scratched or used a skin looks. Lower floats mean cleaner surfaces, though some specific skins really look better (or are valued higher) with higher wear.
- **Pattern Index:** A seed number (from 1 to 1000) that figures out how a texture is mapped onto a weapon. For particular skins, a particular pattern can position a rare design element-- like blue on a Case Hardened knife-- in prime visibility.
- **StatTrak™ Technology:** An optional counter developed into the weapon that digitally tapes the variety of eliminates the owner accomplishes with it.
- **Keepsake Quality:** Items dropped exclusively during main Valve-sponsored esports competitions (Majors), featuring gold sticker labels honoring the match and teams.

The Wear Rating Hierarchy

Understanding skin wear is essential for anybody looking to purchase, sell, or trade. The wear condition is divided into 5 distinct categories:

Exterior Condition	Drift Value	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Pristine condition with very little to no scratches or acnes.
Minimal Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Very light wear, normally little scratches visible just upon close assessment.
Field-Tested (FEET)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious wear and tear, scratches on the body and

paint breaking on edges. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Substantial wear, heavy scratching, and obvious fading of colors. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Very worn, greatly faded, rusted, or scraped appearance.

Note: Some skins are "capped," indicating they can not physically drop in Factory New condition since of how the texture is set.

The Economics of the CS2 Marketplace

What separates Counter-Strike from the majority of other video games is its open, player-driven economy. Valve created a virtual community where digital products hold real-world [CSGO Skins](#) value, sustained by the Steam Community Market and third-party trading platforms.



Factors Driving Skin Prices:

1. **Rarity and Drop Rates:** Just like physical trading cards, the odds of unboxing rare items (like Covert rifles, knives, or gloves) from weapon cases are remarkably low.
2. **Supply and Demand:** If a specific case is no longer dropping in-game, the supply of its consisted of skins ends up being finite, often causing rates to increase with time.
3. **Professional Play (Esports):** When an expert gamer utilizes a particular skin throughout a major competition, need for that item often spikes over night.
4. **Trade-Ups:** Players can trade up 10 skins of one rarity tier for one skin of the next greater tier, completely taking in the input products and changing market supplies.
