

Miller Place has a way of feeling both settled and quietly alive. It is one of those North Shore hamlets where the pace slows just enough for people to notice the trees, the old stonework, the water beyond the bluffs, and the fact that a good meal still matters. You can spend a morning near the shoreline, an afternoon wandering through local roads lined with mature landscaping, and an evening at a restaurant that knows its regulars by name.
