Case Opening	Imitates the in-game case opening experience, however often on third-party websites with custom-curated chances and higher-tier benefit swimming pools. Very variable; normally favors the home heavily.	
Coinflip	An uncomplicated 1v1 PvP video game where two gamers wager skins of approximately equal value. A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 chances, minus a small platform commission (rake).	
Prize	Several gamers contribute skins to a main pot. Each skin's value figures out the player's "ticket" share. A spinner selects one winner who takes everything. Based on the total value contributed; platform takes a percentage charge.	

Functions of Modern CSGO Casinos
