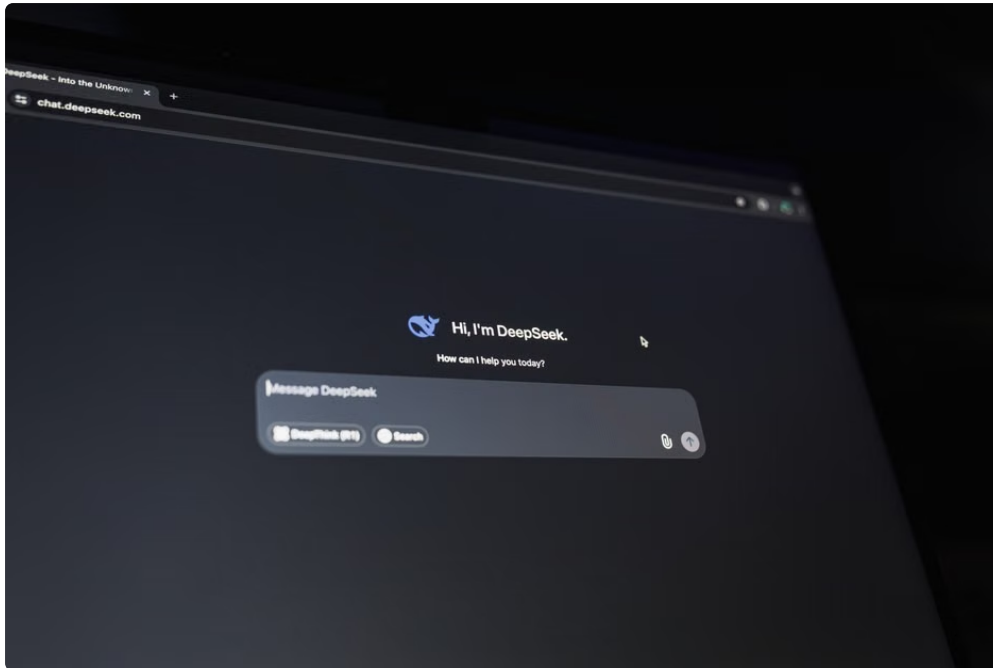

## Multi-Model Chat vs Orchestration: What's the Difference?

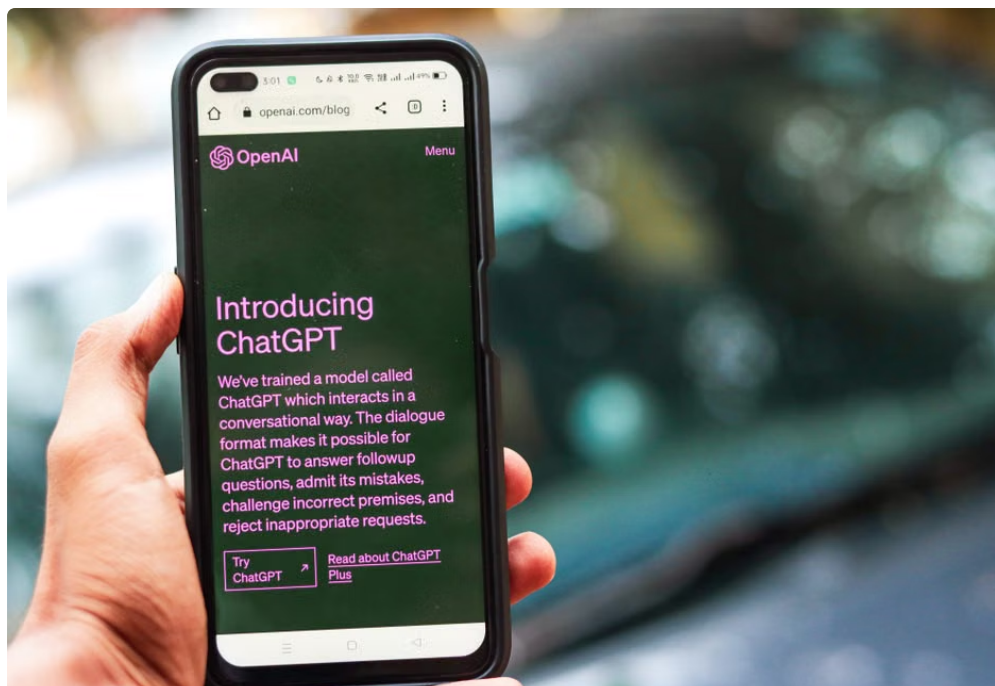
