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Getting the soil chemistry addressed up front saves homeowners from replacing struggling plants year after year, which ends up costing more than doing it right the first time. A simple soil test as part of the initial consultation helps guide exactly which amendments and plant choices make sense for a given property. Solving this kind of problem consistently comes down to experience and a repeatable process rather than a one-off fix that may or may not hold up.
