Can I get a knife from any CS2 case?

No. Knives (and gloves) are tied to particular case pools. For instance, Chroma cases drop Chroma-specific knives, while Operation cases often include distinct glove types. Constantly inspect the "Inspect Case" contents in-game to see the possible Rare Special Items.

Do I require Prime status to get case drops?

Yes. Just accounts with CS2 Prime status (acquired or grandfathered in from CS: GO) are eligible to get weekly case and weapon drops.
