Storage

If storage is necessary, ask about facility security, access policies, pricing, minimum storage periods, climate control, and how belongings are documented while they are in storage.

Specialty Moving

Some possessions require more care than standard household boxes. Pianos, antiques, artwork, safes, large appliances, and other specialty items may require specialized equipment and handling techniques.
