### Common Triggers for CS2 Crashes

# How to Diagnose Your CS2 Crash Site

Identifying the specific moment and factor for a crash needs looking beyond the screen. Players can utilize numerous diagnostic approaches to find out what failed.

- **Check the Windows Event Viewer:** Press the Windows Key, type "Event Viewer," and browse to *Windows Logs > > Application*. Try to find mistake events timed around your crash. Look for entries involving *cs2.exe* or *ntdll.dll*.
- **Analyze Minidumps:** If CS2 generates a dump file (usually found in the primary Steam directory site under *steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive \ video game \ bin \ win64*), advanced users can read these . dmp files utilizing tools like Visual Studio or WinDbg to find the precise line of code that stopped working.
- **Monitor Hardware Temperatures:** Use software application like MSI Afterburner or HWMonitor to inspect if your CPU or GPU is thermal throttling or hitting important temperature thresholds when the crash occurs.

### 1. Confirm Integrity of Game Files

- Open Steam and go to your Library.

### 2. Update Graphics Drivers

### 5. Handle Launch Options

- Get rid of old or conflicting launch choices from CS2's properties in Steam. Commands created for CS: GO (like -high or custom-made tickrate commands) can typically break CS2 functionality.

## 6. Run as Administrator and Check Antivirus

- Make sure cs2.exe and steam.exe are running with administrative advantages.
- Add the CS2 installation folder to your antivirus software application's exclusion list to prevent security suites from wrongly flagging video game files.
