

Counter-Strike: Global Offensive (CS: GO) has constructed a lively economy around weapon "cases." When a case is opened, the game rolls a random number for each tier, with the chances heavily weighted towards lower-rarity products. The highest-tier [cs2 cases](#) "Gold" products (knife or glove finishes) appear just about 0.25% of the time, making them the true chase products.

2. How Players Obtain Cases

- In-game drops**-- After a match, the game might award a totally free case (one weekly).
- Buy from the Steam Community Market (SCM)**-- Cases are listed for a few cents to numerous dollars, depending on rarity and need.
- Direct purchase from the in-game "Arms Deal" shop**-- Some older cases can be purchased for a fixed price, though lots of have been retired.
- Trading with other players**-- Cases are common trade properties on third-party markets and Steam trades.

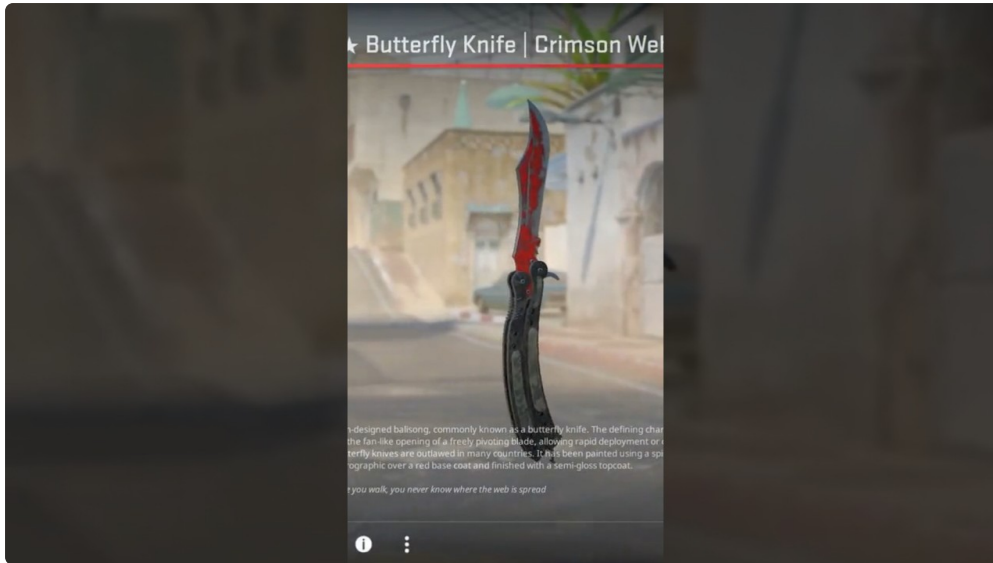

Note: Prices fluctuate constantly based on supply, need, and seasonal events. Constantly examine the SCM for the most up-to-date figures.

4. Opening a Case: Mechanics and Odds

1. **Purchase a crucial**-- Most cases need a "Case Key," buyable from the in-game purchase about £ 2.50 (GBP). Some more recent cases are "keyless" and open quickly for a flat charge.
2. **Open the case**-- Click "Open" in the inventory; the video game exposes a product from the swimming pool.
3. **Get the item**-- If the skin is undesirable, gamers can note it on the SCM or trade it away.
