- **Appeal:** Simple guidelines and familiar mechanics draw in casual and experienced bettors alike.

4. Jackpot/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple gamers deposit skins into a collective pot. Each skin contributes tickets based upon its dollar worth. A random draw picks a winner, where a greater total contribution yields a higher statistical opportunity of winning the whole pot.
- **Appeal:** The ultimate "high-roller" video game mode, where single fortunate winners can win thousands of dollars in uncommon digital products.

Traditional Casino Games vs. CSGO-Themed Games
