Why 24/7 availability matters

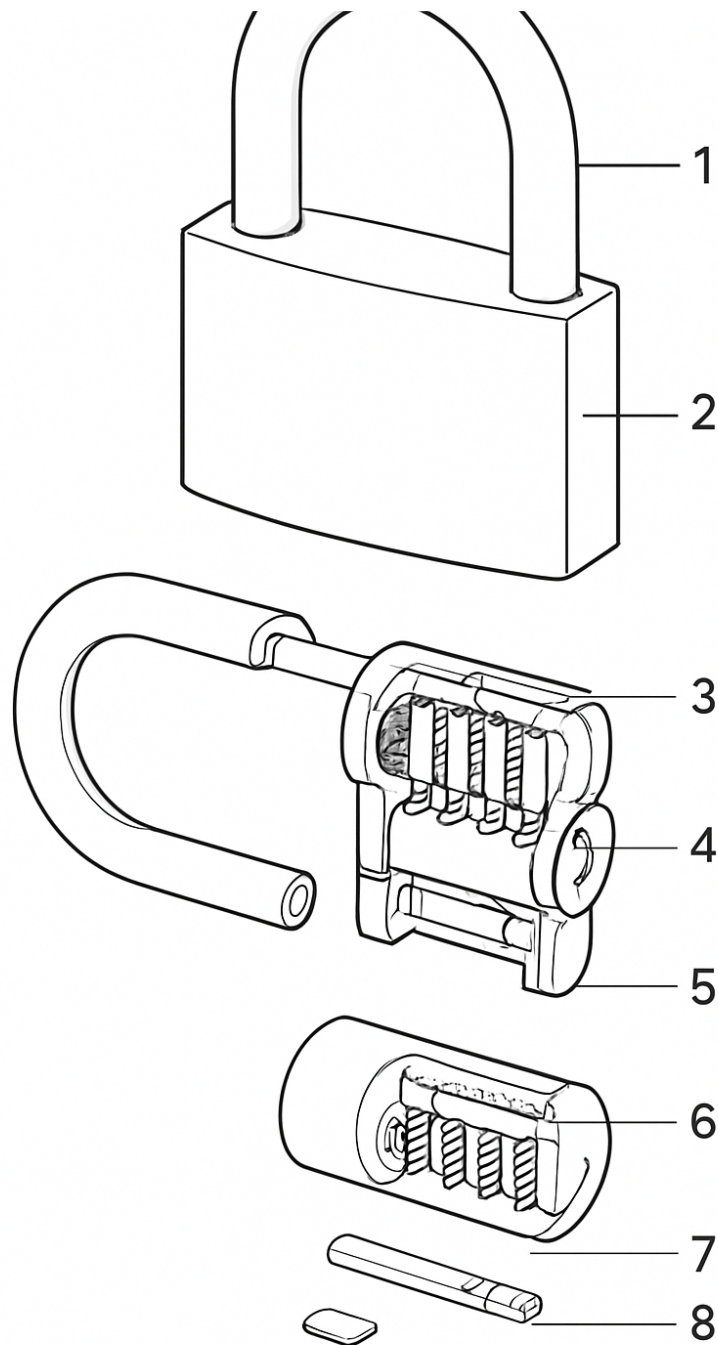
