For non-EU/EEA license holders (e.g., USA, India, UK post-Brexit, Ukraine), the guidelines are more stringent:

- Licenses from countries that signed the **1968 Vienna Convention on Road Traffic** can generally be exchanged directly, though tests might be needed depending on bilateral arrangements and residency duration.
- Licenses from nations under the **1949 Geneva Convention** generally need passing the theoretical state examination.
